



Intel Foundation FAQs

Q: What are the funding objectives for the Intel Foundation?

A: Intel foundation provides funding for both national grants with broad-based impact and, community grants focused where Intel has major facilities. Contribution programs are guided by three major objectives: advance education in math, science, and engineering; promote the entrance of women and under-represented minorities into careers in science and engineering; and support Intel employees' efforts to improve the quality of life in their communities.

Q: How does my organization apply for a Foundation grant?

A: The Intel Foundation does not accept unsolicited grant requests. If you are an organization located in a community with a major Intel facility, you may apply for Intel Corporate funds at <http://www.intel.com/community/grant.htm>

Q: Does the Intel Foundation make donations of equipment?

A: Due to IRS rules, the Intel Foundation does not make donation of equipment

Q: What geographic areas are eligible for foundation grants?

A: If the organization is in a community with a major Intel site, grants should be requested through the local Corporate Affairs office. For all other communities, the foundation does not accept unsolicited donation requests. Q: Does the Intel Foundation support programs outside of the United States?

A: Due to legal and tax requirements for a US organization to give funds to a non-US organization, the Intel Foundation limits grants to non-US organizations that support specific Intel Corporate programs. Unsolicited grants requests are not accepted and will not be funded.

Q: Does the Intel Foundation offer scholarships and fellowships to individuals?

A: Due to tax and legal rules, individuals are not eligible for scholarships. All scholarships (except through the Intel Scholarship for Employee's Children) and fellowships are given through specific universities and community colleges. Please check with your school to determine if Intel offers scholarships/fellowships and the selection criteria.

Q: What is the Intel Foundation's policy on matching disaster relief efforts?

A: The Intel Foundation cannot respond to all disasters that occur around the world. The local Corporate Affairs Group in the local country/community may request that the Intel Foundation to approve a matching program for a specific disaster. The Intel Foundation

- **DOES** respond/match:
 - o Direct impact on Intel sites/employees
 - o Existing resources overwhelmed
 - o Express public pressure and direct requests to Intel from sr gov't officials
- Does **NOT** respond/match:
 - o Man-made disasters
 - o US sanctions (keep Intel legal),
 - o Regionally common (floods, etc.),
 - o On-going humanitarian efforts (e.g. famine, AIDS)
